Haulin' the Hume 2015

Yes it's been run again.

For me it was with the same crew. Peter, the owner of the well presented B series Mack with low loader (also the Peterbilt) was in New Zealand participating in a rally for Austin Healeys the week prior to our Sydney run and was to arrive home the day before we departed for Sydney. That's enthusiasm!

In preparation, I loaded the "apple truck" onto the low loader the week before. So Anzac Day for me was spent in the city for the dawn service with my 2 youngest, then two days at work and early Thursday morning we fired up the trucks and were off into the peak hour traffic, across though Heidelberg to the Hume. Peter and Fred in the 59 Mack, Chris and myself following in the 46 Peterbilt.

We stayed overnight in Gundagai and on the next morning to Sydney and the Clarendon showgrounds at Richmond.

We arrived early enough to see a lot of the trucks rolling in; the local hot rod club organised an evening meal; and we retired to the motel around ten thirty.

Up early next morning for registration and down the old Hume with a lunch break at Goulburn show-grounds.

We were advised not to move the trucks until a predetermined time. This was great for it allowed time to look at the other trucks on the run (300) but also outside were lots of car club member cars, rods etc, who had come out to see the trucks also.

With lunch done, it was then off to Yass our destination and the evening formal meal, also the customary swapping of yarns of the trip down. Another stay overnight with a final gathering for an informal breakfast, random departure time and off down the track for home.

On the way home we stopped at Tarcutta and visited the wall dedicated to all the truckies tragically killed on the Hume over the years in their line of work - it's



quite chilling to see how many there are! The names and their call signs are all on brass plaques.

I have done four of these runs now, and I am still amazed at how many people both in the towns and on the side of the road come out to see the trucks roll through.

The enthusiasm was highlighted to me when I pulled over to a safe spot to refuel (miles from anywhere) and there was a young family parked and watching us all come through, they were most enthusiastic. The gentleman advised me they had traveled four hours from Young to wave us through. (that's dedication!)

Somehow all the effort you put into preparing for such a trip seems worthwhile ---it certainly made my day to think of a busy young family with the effort and what they had done and how many others had done the same or similar.

The truck ran well with no issues, however just a short reminder to all T owners, - - - if you inadvertently turn of the ignition at full noise, DO NOT turn it straight back on - - - yes it was bloody noisy for the rest of the day!

AOMC DELEGATE'S REPORT Meeting Date 18th. May 2015

A copy of the minutes of this meeting are available on the AOMC website at www.aomc.asn.au. The summary below contains my understanding of the main items which I believe are of interest to the members of the MTFCV.

New Delegates / Member Clubs.

4 new delegates, 2 visitors and 0 new member clubs were welcomed.

Treasurers Report.

The Treasurers report was presented to the Delegates. The Association is in a healthy financial state.

The annual American Car Show was cancelled due to inclement weather. This resulted in a budget deficit of approximately \$20,000 until the show is held at a later date.

Guest Speaker.

The guest speaker for this evening was Mr. Travis Osbourne who runs a company called MOBILETYRESHOP.com.au Phone 1300 687 000. They operate a mobile tyre sales and fitting business. ie. They come to you. They offer a same day service and carry no stock, with 2 deliveries per day. Their on site service also includes alignment and balancing.

Travis spoke on the huge ongoing problems associated with getting rid of old tyres. Of the top 30 best selling cars only 10 have a full size spare wheel. Spacesaver spare wheels have very limited use.

The largest tyre manufacturer in the world is Leggo. Michelin are now importing cross ply tyres into Australia.

Presidents Report.

Iain advised that the AOMC patron, Mr Malcolm Fraser had recently passed away.

The WA permit system issues with Victorian clubs has recently been resolved.

Club permit scheme report.

Rod Amos reported on the ongoing discussions with VicRoads as follows.

Still working on how to deal with modified vehicles including a checklist to assist clubs with the issue.

The statement "declared safe for use on the road" is to be deleted from the forms.

Whether failure to fill out a logbook will be treated as driving an unregistered vehicle or fraudulent use of a motor vehicle.

VSI 33 does not apply to motorcycles.

Following death the transfer of a vehicle to a spouse without a RWC.

Still looking at what constitutes a club.

Looking at guidelines for LMCTs who are not familiar with older vehicles.

There is still confusion with permit renewals. It is suggested you keep the receipt for renewal in the back of the logbook, even though the slip has been stamped by VicRoads.

It is suggested clubs request a list of permitted vehicles and cross check with club records.

Another governing entity is stating that the 25 year eligibility for CPS eligibility has been extended to 30 years. Although under discussion no change has yet been ratified from the 25 year requirement.

The CPS system has been outsourced by VicRoads. The CPS vehicles are not on the main VicRoads data base

VicRoads are still looking at the requirement for a RWC when transferring from club to club.

FEDERATION DELEGATES MEETING

HELD AT HOBSONS BAY MENS SHED IN ALTONA ON THE 2ND MAY 2015

We were welcomed by the President of Hobsons Bay Mens Shed. They have 318 members and 100 of those are in the historic vehicles side.

Trophy grants of \$150.00 were provided to Wangaratta and Maryborough. The Morris Club of Victoria re-joined the Federation after being away for almost 2 years.

John Lewis from Vic Roads attended the meeting to provide a short update but mainly to answer questions from Delegates. VR are still bedding down the changes at head office and out in all their Branches. Currently there are 65,466 CPS permitted vehicles on the road. But at the start of 2011 when Log Books started there were just 10,000. Just over 1,000 clubs hold the rights forvehicles to be on the CPS via that club but 250 clubs have not signed up to the new VR requirements that were due early February 2015. They will now have their CPS rights cancelled. Several clubs have withdrawn. VR are now looking at Replicas and how Victoria deals with those as no other State or Territory allows them onto CPS. Also looking at the requirements of Competition vehicles on the RP plates. Age of eligible vehicles to move from 25 years to 30 years in yearly increments. John then took questions.

- Photos. As per the agreement. Front, back, both sides and the drivers compartment. Plus if it has ID plates then copies of those. No need for these on renewals. Just first time joined to the CPS after 1.2.2015.
- Dates of photos if there is no electronic date on the photo then Secretary to write it on the back of each and sign them all as the person assuming responsibility that the date is correct.
- Inter Club Transfers No requirement for new RWC when they transfer in from another CPS Club. It can be a By Law of the Club but not required by VR. The new Club accepts responsibility for the vehicle and must take action the first time they believe it is not safe. New club to provide a letter to VR saying they agree with the vehicle coming into the club.
- Renewals VR allows a very short grace for renewals and then full RWC again and club approval etc. There is an app. from VR that can remind you on your mobile that your Rego is due.
- M Plates 85 issued so far. Police are active in looking at ones they feel should be on M plates and issuing defect notices if they have not been engineered.
- Unregistered vehicle fine John confirmed it's \$780.00 now.
- Log Book entry They are to record each day of use. Fill them in at the start of use and the first drivers name only.
- Members who are not Financial at their club Clubs are to advise VR as soon as annual memberships are not paid and VR will note that the CPS renewal is not to be issued to that person for all their vehicles attached to that club.

Picnic days were then discussed and Mortlake, Wunghnu and Scoresby. All went off very well. Jack Britain's 1930's electric wan was a hit at Mortlake and sat beside a 2015 electric vehicle. Scoresby Park - The petting animal zoo was appreciated by City kids who don't get a chance to be close to animals. Tractor numbers increased at Wunghnu but cars were down but plenty of room if you want to go next year. There will be a run from Bendigo to Castlemaine especially for veteran and vintage, starting with breakfast at Bendigo clubrooms. Notification required.

RACV and VACC motoring Show in Melbourne - This event was excellent and the public numbers acceptable.

National Historic Motoring Day - Federation is looking for reports on these days from around the State for August AHMF meeting. Fed News is still looking for future events articles from Clubs. If none are volunteered then Club names will be drawn out each meeting and they will have to submit some articles of interest.

2015 Golden Oldies. This starts from Marong Picnic. This is a Vintage only vehicle event and they have 38 so far. Plenty of room for more to join but be quick. Again sponsored by RACV.

Federation Funds – With the payments to Clubs for Delegates attending meetings, provision for the 5 free picnic days, free lunches at Delegates meetings, trophy grants and capital grants and the payment of the day to day accounts the income from the Swap and interest on funds is under the budget required to run Federation. Delegates were reminded that the Federation owns the Swap and Magazine and they need to advertise the Swap back in their home towns and to work hard selling the magazines at the Swap so that the Federation then has enough funds to continue to support Clubs. If not cut backs will take place.

Insurance Cover and Event Check Lists – Most important that Clubs hold Voluntary Workers Cover. Prior to events Clubs should fill in a check list of possible dangers in running the event and that these be held for inspection by Work Cover if there is an accident.

AGM Next meeting – at Baw Baw Club.

BENDIGO SWAP. Rebecca, Merv, Wendy, Richard and Rob from Bendigo Swap Committee were thanked for coming to the meeting. Delegates and Committee appreciated the \$22,500 50% payment received despite it being the lowest in 10 years. All seemed pleased that it was continuing past 2015. 2016 and onwards - Outdoor site and Saturday Public Entry fees will rise. This is to offset the increase in costs for provision of toilets, insurance, cleaning, security and general items in runningthe Swap.

Site Bookings – All outdoor sites are either booked or on offer to people. The waiting list does not have any more people who have vehicle related items to sell.

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
