



AOMC Delegates Report Meeting Date 15th.February 2016. Venue. Chevrolet Car Club Rooms. Moorabbin.

A copy of the minutes of this meeting are available on the AOMC website at www.aomc.asn.au. The summary below contains my understanding of the main items which I believe are of interest to our members. New Delegates / Member Clubs. 1 new delegate, 3 visitors and 1 new member club were welcomed. Treasurers Report. The Treasurer's report was presented to the Delegates. The Association is in a healthy financial state. The balance at Dec. 2015 is up on the previous year. This is mainly due to the car shows revenue, increased membership fees and the sale of the CPS handbook.

Guest Speaker. There were 2 guest speakers the first being Senator Ricky Muir (Motoring Enthusiast Party) and Frank Burke (Old Hume Highway 31)

Ricky Muir spoke on his rise to fame in entering politics. His party was started as a result of Anti Hoon Laws in Queensland. Whilst now representing the motoring movement he previously worked as a labourer in country Victoria making leather goods for car manufacturing, then moving on to various roles in the timber industry. His hobbies included outback motoring, 4 wheel driving and dirt bike riding, as well as making DVD's relevant to his interests. He also owns several modern classic cars.

He spoke on the differences between Federal and State politics. He also referred to "The Motor Vehicle Standard Act", Private Importing of Vehicles and Consumer Law in relation to "Lemon" Vehicles. He briefly raised imports of modern vehicles, imports meeting ADR's / European Standards, sharing info. on data and repair / choice of repairer.

Questions from the floor included the training of younger workers in vehicle restoration similar to the UK, and opportunities in the aftermarket industry, speed cameras meeting Commonwealth NATA standards and of course petrol pricing.

Part of his frustration in his role is the fact that the government does not recognise Motor Sport as a sport in Australia

Second speaker was Frank Burke who spoke on the Highway 31 project.

In conjunction with the National Trust a run is to be held on 28th and 29th May from Broadmeadows to Albury following as much as possible of the old Hume Highway. This date has been chosen, as it is the 60th Anniversary of the National Trust. At the Sat. night dinner the old highway will be declared as classified, being the first highway to gain this recognition. Part of the old highway is now private land but much of the original road is accessible.

Club permit scheme report. The AOMC now has a group of 4 who attend Vicroads meetings in relation to the CPS.

It has been agreed the AOMC will act as a funnel for submissions to Vicroads in relation to "Rogue" vehicles on the scheme. Pic's may be forwarded by interested persons who believe a vehicle is non compliant. All pic's should be dated and the location recorded.

A policy is being prepared regarding the allocation of H or M plates.

Replicas still ongoing but looks like being a vehicle with the same parts as the original. Not a new skin on an older vehicle.

Motorhomes are currently being reviewed re. eligibility to the CPS.

More than 100 clubs have been removed from the CPS over recent times, for various non-compliance issues. Clubs requesting a list of club vehicles on CPS from Vicroads are waiting too long for a response.

Compliance versus build date still not resolved.

The position of Secretary is being resolved.

A minute's silence was observed for long time delegate Peter Gabe who recently passed away.

It was requested an additional trophy be awarded at the American day display.

The RACV has a new CEO, Neil Taylor. Neil's background was with Greyhound Bus Lines.

AOMC DELEGATES REPORT CONTINUED.....

Daryl Meek is currently finalising the budget for RACV sponsorship for club events and needs any proposed submissions by the end of February.

Victoria is the only state where motorhomes are eligible for H or M plates. (under review).

Historic Winton is to be held on the last weekend in May.


