Thanks Alan for a great outing-we just loved it. Mickie and Jack Turner.





I RECALL Loveland & Loader Panel Beaters and Used Cars in Dana St in Ballarat, next door to a multilevel car park, (where the fridge swap is held).

I looked up the phone book and couldn't find a Haslem , but did find one Loveland, Winston, whom I visited. He was 90 at the time and a son of Arthur, the pioneer that is mentioned in the Ballarat Vintage and Classic Car Club 40yrs celebration Book.

Loveland and Haslem were Ford Agents 1921 to 1923 so their dates the Oil Can. It has a swivel out pourer lip and is made of a very thin metal and butt joint soldered. They would make poor fuel cans due to the risk of the joint splitting and I guess this befell the fate of most that were made.

They were made by Gadsdens of Melbourne who still make drink containers. The front and rear of the can depicts a sedan, one side has a Roadster and the other a Tourer.


