Day 2 'Ned Kelly' Tour

On Sunday we headed to Beechworth for the next part of the tour. We left Everton and the convoy made the journey to Eldorado for our first stop at the Dredge. The Dredge rests in a pond dug by the monstrous machine, which in its day extracted over 70,000 ounces of gold from the Eldorado area.



From here we headed onto town for a quick stop and refuel – coffee and food – and visited the smallest pub in Victoria before the drive to Beechworth.

We drove through the Woolshed Valley, where Joe Byrne attended school with Aaron Sherrett who would later become another chapter in the Kelly Gang's story. Geof took us along the road until we came to the place where Sherrett's hut was, the place where his murder took place and what was the prelude to the Glenrowan siege. From here we were also shown the area in which the 'Kelly Caves' were and where the Chinese gardens and homes were. It's hard to imagine in this bush area is where it all took place!

After a quick history lesson from Geof and John we followed the road into Beechworth. We were hanging out to visit the Bakery and the Lollyshop!

Meeting at the park we waited for our tour to begin once we had all had lunch. The tour was great! We visited the many haunts of the Kelly Gang, their sympathisers and enemies. The guide was very thorough and informative, almost as good as Geof!

Walking around the town we visited the Pubs, Businesses and Lock Ups that all had something to do with the Bushranger. The museum is where the tour ended and we were able to see many pieces of Kelly Gang Memorabilia. We saw the Jerilderie Letter, Armour Replicas, Pieces of Furniture, Photos and 'Betty' which was Ned's favourite rifle.

We all headed home after a very full on day, ready to rest and relax!

A visit to Brown Brothers Winery was enjoyed by the adults! Dad though it would be a good idea to take the T and it was until it rained! Thanks Mickey and Jack for taking us back so we could stay warm and dry!

That night we had a BBQ tea with the other members at the Caravan Park and had a meeting afterwards.

Thanks to Geof and John for organising the run, it was fun and we learnt more about Ned Kelly and his Gang. The area was great to visit and there was something for everyone!
