This ambulance is a recreation of the first motorised ambulance service in Western Australia.

The body for this recreation was built from measurements taken off an old black & white photograph as no records or specifications existed of the original Ford ambulance.

St John Ambulance Association commissioned British Motor Restorations to build a replica ambulance on a 1917 Ford Model T chassis for the Centenary of the Association in 1992.

The ambulance attends occasional events for St John and is a regular attendee at the annual Classic Car Show



Day 1was spent at the Griffith Pioneer Museum with our cars displayed in an historic village setting.




Day 2 was a drive to Whitton and visits to a museum, Malthouse for lunch and also a cotton gin.

- Bendigo Swap: Is on 11 and 12 November. All is in hand with setup on Friday 10.
- December 3 the Central Victorian Restoration Group is holding a display at the Prince of Wales Showgrounds (Swap Meet Site) to celebrate 100 years or Farmall Tractors. All those with historic vehicles, tractors or stationary engines can attend for free.

2024 Events:

- Mortlake Picnic is on March 24 and will be the 20th Picnic here. The local shire is assisting.
- Wunghnu Vehicle Machinery and Collectables will have a display on the 30th&31st March. This is over the Easter Weekend and will also celebrate the 100 years of Farmall Tractors.
- Scoresby Picnic is on **May 5** at the National Steam Centre. Free entry for cars over 25 yrs. Trade and craft displays as well as steam displays.
- Murrabit Picnic May 19. First time for this event with lots of new local vehicles. The Federation Delegates
 meeting is in Kerang the day before.
- Baw Baw Picnic will be on Oct 20.
- The Peter Mac fundraiser will run in March 2024.

- Open Federation Tour: 2023 has been run and an excellent week of touring and activities were enjoyed. It travelled from the Marong Picnic to Kerang, Swan Hill, Echuca and Shepparton.
- Federation/OAMC Joint Meetings: These meetings in Gisborne have been put on hold because answers from VicRoads have not been forthcoming and the AOMC President has been away. The errors with the club permit renewals have been discussed with no response from Vic Roads.
- Golden Oldies Tour 2024: This will be held in and around Daylesford, Geelong and Ballarat area and will leave from the Marong Picnic.
- Banners with Federation on: The committee have been asked for a Federation Banner to use at Club events each
 month. It's an excellent idea to promote your club along with the Federation. If your club is interested in these
 banners with both your club's name and the Federation name on it, please let your club reps know. Financial
 assistance can be given if required.


