Rally Report



'Crawlin' the Hume' - April 6

This is a truck run which runs from Campbellfield to Albury showgrounds bi-annually, then on the off year from Sydney to Yass. This year there were 300 trucks entered and 50 or more not officially on the run but enjoyed the trip! The run is for commercial vehicles 25 years or older, and runs as close as is practical in the old Hume Highway 31, this

bring us through the towns by-passed by the freeway which we have today. The trucks were looking newer this year, Kenworth, Mack, Diamond Rio, Diamond T, Dodge, International, Fords from 1951 to F series, Thames, Louivilles etc.,

Autocar and Austin, Bedford, Atkinson, Commer and others. They were in all configurations, trays, covered semi, tarped semi, bobtail and low loader.

Briefly, we run through Wallan and over Pretty Sally to Broadford, Tallarook, Seymour, Avenel, Euroa, and through Benalla for the lunch break at Winton race circuit. After lunch we again head North to Glenrowan and through Wangaratta, Springhurst and Chiltern up through Barnawatha, on to Wodonga and in to the Albury show grounds for dinner.

My story started some years ago on this run and it has certainly been an event I have enjoyed. This year my brother-in-law drove an Austin 450N and I in the TT. We rose quite early and were lining up at the start around 6am. It is good to get there early and organise stickers etc. for the run, and it gives you a chance to catch up with a few of the chaps whom we have met along the way in previous years, plus an opportunity to look at a few trucks arriving which I have not seen in previous runs.

As usual I get away pretty early, as I need to make a mile before the larger trucks get in front of me, probably half of them have passed me by Broadford. One of my highlights this year was rounding up a loaded B-Double tanker going up Pretty Sally. The circumstances just happened to be right, needless to say, once the tanker reached the top and found another 4 or 5 gears he made me look stationary!

The next day across the highway to Ancona, Strathbogie on through Highlands to Yea, then Flowerdale, Whittlesea and home. (and beat the weather!). The first part of the home run I have done before but it is just so pretty. The second part up in the Strathbogies, I wasn't so familiar with but gosh it certainly didn't disappoint! 
Under the Hood - Editorial







Model T Accessories: Brass Era Starter Motors


In 1912, Cadillac became the first car company to have an electric starter motor as standard equipment on their cars. Electric starter motors did not appear on Model Ts until the 1919 Production year. From 1912 to 1919 and afterwards, a number of manufacturers offered retro fitted electric starters for the Model T pre starter era.




Old Victorian Garages


